Residency Information

We are pleased to offer two new fully funded three-week residencies for early career visual artists based in the UK. The Material Futures residents will receive a fee, materials/equipment allowance, and a travel allowance.

These new residencies build upon the residencies and projects Cove Park launched in 2021 which focus upon the climate crisis, the biodiversity crisis, climate justice, and sustainability. This work involves Cove Park's role as co-founder and co-lead of NAARCA: the Nordic Alliance of Artists Residencies on Climate Action, the Argyll Beacon, developed through our ongoing partnership with Argyll & the Isles Coast & Countryside Trust, the 4-year Sculpting Futures: Ecologies in the Making residency programme with the Academy of Fine Arts, Helsinki, and our partnership with the Food Lab at the Jan van Eyck Academie, Maastricht.

The Material Futures Residencies are funded by The Fenton Arts Trust.

About Cove Park

Cove Park is an international residency located on an outstanding 50-acre rural site on Scotland's west coast, just one hour north of Glasgow. Over its 23-year history Cove Park has hosted approximately 4,000 local, national, and international artists, creative practitioners, writers, and researchers, working in all art forms and at every career stage. We support artists and collaborative groups by offering the time and support required for research, experimentation, the production of new work, and peer-to-peer exchange. Cove Park creates a stimulating context in which new ideas can be developed, tested, and shared. Our aim is to play a vital and dynamic role in our nation's cultural life, making possible innovative creative work, facilitating cultural exchange, and enriching the lives of the communities we serve.

Overlooking Loch Long on Argyll's Rosneath peninsula, Cove Park's site was formerly a conservation park. It comprises partially managed woodland, ponds, and fields for grazing sheep and Highland cows. The facilities include nine shipping containers - recycled and converted into private accommodation and studios - and two oak-framed buildings ideal for those working in collaboration or families. The Jacobs Building opened in 2016 and is an award-winning, purpose-built communal space, providing workspace, rooms for public events, a library, open-plan kitchen and dining area, and offices, plus two adjacent units of accommodation and studios.

Key Points

- The residency is designed to support visual artists working with or developing sustainable materials and processes as part of their creative practice.
- The residents should be in the early stages of developing their career (this is not defined by age we recognise that creative careers can be established at any age).
- The residents will receive a total residency fee of £1,500 (£500 per week), plus a materials/equipment allowance of up to £250 and a travel allowance of £150.
- The residency is designed to support research and the development of current or new work, with a focus upon the use and exploration of sustainable materials and processes.
- Cove Park's team will support the resident's research and practical requirements leading up to and during the residency.

What Cove Park Provides

- Individual private accommodation and a private studio on site at Cove Park.
- Work and meeting space within the communal Jacobs Building.
- Unlimited access to the 50-acre site.

Who Can Apply, How to Apply, Shortlisting and Appointment Process

To be eligible to apply you should be based in the UK and in the early stages of developing your career.

Your application must include:

- Your name and contact details.
- A brief statement (no more than 500 words) briefly describing your current work and the reasons for your interest in this specific residency.
- Your CV

Please submit documentation of recent work. This may include:

- Up to 6 images, and additionally:
- Film or video work should be submitted on a showreel (maximum duration 5 minutes) uploaded to Youtube or Vimeo, with the link provided in the application letter.
- Audio work (maximum duration 5 minutes) should be uploaded to Soundcloud, with the link provided in the application letter.

We can accept submissions in audio or video formats if this is preferable to a written application. If you consider yourself to have a disability, please tell us if there are any reasonable adjustments to the application process that would be of assistance to you. The applications will be reviewed by Cove Park's <u>Programme team and a member of its</u> <u>Advisory Committee</u> and we will confirm the outcome of the process by Friday 9 September 2023.
