PROGRAMME INFORMATION & APPLICATION GUIDELINES

Overview

This is a fully funded one-week residency for a Cove Park Associate (a former Cove Park resident and member of the Associates Programme) working in any art form or creative discipline and based in Scotland. The residency is linked to the creation and delivery of two half-day or one full day workshop for pupils at John Logie Baird Primary School (Nurture Unit), Helensburgh, with support from Cove Park's Curator of Engagement.

The resident will receive a fee and travel allowance. The workshop will take place at Cove Park with a minimum of 7 pupils drawn from different year groups and classes in the school. This residency is supported by The Hugh Fraser Foundation.

Key Points

- The residency at Cove Park is scheduled to take place from Monday 4 November to Sunday 10 November 2024, but we may be able to negotiate alternative dates during the autumn and winter of 2024/25.
- The resident should have previous experience of devising and delivering participatory projects and workshops within a school setting.

- The resident will receive a total residency fee of £800, plus a travel allowance of £70.
- Cove Park's Curator of Engagement and team will support the development and delivery of the workshop, and the work the resident wishes to undertake at Cove Park.

What Cove Park Provides

- Individual private accommodation and studio on site at Cove Park.
- Workspace and meeting space within the communal Jacobs Building.
- Unlimited access to the 50-acre site.

Who Can Apply, How to Apply, Shortlisting and Appointment Process

To be eligible to apply you should be based in Scotland and a member of the Associates programme. More information on the Associates programme and current members is available here.

Applications can be submitted via the online **Application Form**.

The Application Form must include:

- Your name and contact details.
- A brief statement (no more than 500 words) briefly describing your current work and the reasons for your interest in this residency.
- Your CV

Please submit documentation of recent work relevant to this project. This may include:

- Up to 6 images of recent work or current projects.
- Film or video work should be submitted on a showreel (maximum duration 5 minutes) uploaded to Youtube or Vimeo, with the link provided in the application letter.
- Audio work (maximum duration 5 minutes) should be uploaded to Soundcloud, with the link provided in the application letter.
- Prose, no more than 1000 words (no more than 4 pages).
- Poetry, up to 4 poems (no more than 4 pages).

We can accept submissions in audio or video formats if this is preferable to a written application. If you consider yourself to have a disability, please tell us if there are any reasonable adjustments to the application process that would be of assistance to you. If you would like to discuss this, or need help making your application, please contact Emma Henderson directly.

We will acknowledge receipt of your application as soon as it is received. This acknowledgement will include a link to our anonymous Equalities, Diversity & Inclusion monitoring form for completion and we would be grateful for your time with this. If you do not receive this acknowledgement, please contact Cove Park directly to confirm receipt of your application.

The applications will be reviewed by Cove Park's Programme team and a member of its Advisory Committee, and we will confirm the outcome of the process by Monday 9 September 2024.
