PROGRAMME INFORMATION & APPLICATION GUIDELINES

Overview

Cove Park's Emerging Visual Artist Residency is for a visual artist based in Scotland and in the early stages of developing their practice. Developed by Cove Park in partnership with The Bridge Awards, this two-week fully funded residency offers time for self-directed studio work and the development of new ideas and projects.

This is a fully funded residency and the artist will receive a fee, a travel allowance, and a research/materials allowance.

About Cove Park

Cove Park is an international artists' residency based on an outstanding 50-acre rural site in Argyll on the west coast of Scotland. We host local, national, and international artists and creative practitioners working in all art forms and at every career stage. Cove Park provides the facilities, support, and care required for the development of new ideas and projects, collaborations, and interdisciplinary practice. Residents stay on site in private accommodation with access to private studios, communal work and meeting spaces, and a library. We host up to 12 residents at any one time, offering every resident the opportunity meet and work alongside individuals and collaborative groups from a wide range of backgrounds and experiences. We organise informal peer-to-peer events to promote discussion, the exchange of ideas and experiences, and the development of new connections.

Emerging Visual Artist Residency 2024: Key Points

- The residency is scheduled to begin on Monday 26 August and end on Sunday 8 September 2024. However, it is also possible through discussion with Cove Park to divide the residency into two separate weeks to support other work, caring, or family commitments, and for the second week to take place later in the year (before the end of March 2025).
- This residency is for a visual artist in the early stages of their careers (at any age) currently living and working in Scotland.
- The artist will receive a fee of £550 per week, plus a travel allowance of up to £100 and a research/materials allowance of up to £75.
- The residency is self-directed and designed to support the development of new work, research, and experimentation.
- Cove Park's team will support research and practical requirements leading up to and during the residency.





What Cove Park Provides

- Individual private accommodation and studio (please note, our residencies are selfcatering).
- Workspace and meeting space within the Jacobs Building, a communal space which has a library, a large rehearsal room with a wooden floor, open-plan kitchen, and dining area.
- Unlimited access to the 50-acre site.
- The full support of Cove Park's team.

How to Apply, Shortlisting and Appointment Process

Applications can be submitted via the online <u>Application Form.</u> The Application Form must include:

- · Your name and contact details.
- A statement (no more than 500 words) briefly describing your current work and the reasons for your interest in this residency.
- Your CV, including the names and contact details of two professional referees, from a teacher, tutor, or employer for example (please note we will only contact your referees if your application is shortlisted for interview).

Please submit documentation of recent work. This may include:

- Up to 6 images
- Film or video work should be submitted on a showreel (maximum duration 5 minutes) uploaded to YouTube or Vimeo, with the link provided in the application letter.
- Audio work (maximum duration 5 minutes) should be uploaded to Soundcloud, with the link provided in the application letter.

We can accept submissions in audio or video formats if this is preferable to a written application. If you consider yourself to have a disability, please tell us if there are any reasonable adjustments to the application process that would be of assistance to you. If you would like to discuss this, or need help making your application, please contact Cove Park's Programmes & Communications Producer <u>Alex Marrs</u> directly.

Selection for interview will be based on the following criteria:

- The creative strength of your work and ideas.
- Your need for a period of research and development and your reasons for applying to this programme.
- · Your interest in working within a community of artists.

Deadline for applications: Monday 8 July 2024 (5pm BST)

We will acknowledge receipt of your application as soon as it is received. This acknowledgement will include a link to our anonymous Equality, Diversity & Inclusion monitoring form for completion and we would be grateful for your time with this. If you do not receive this acknowledgement, please contact Cove Park directly to confirm receipt of your application.

The applications will be shortlisted for interview by Cove Park Staff and Advisors.

All applicants will be notified if their submission has been shortlisted for interview by Friday 19 July 2024.

Interviews will take place via Zoom during the week of Monday 22 July 2024.
