ABOUT COVE PARK

Cove Park is an international artists residency located on an outstanding 50-acre rural site overlooking Loch Long on the Rosneath Peninsula. Over our 23-year history Cove Park has hosted approximately 4,000 local, national, and international artists, creative practitioners, writers, and researchers, working in all art forms and at every career stage. Our residencies provide artists with the time and space to develop wonderful new work including film, music, books, exhibitions and performances. Our public engagement and creative learning programme shares the work of our resident artists with our local community and welcomes visitors of all ages to Cove Park for a wide range of projects, workshops, and events. Outreach activity - such as the Argyll-wide Artists in Schools programme and Project Studio, a free youth-led programme for teenagers in Helensburgh interested in art, creativity and activism - take the work of Cove Park and our resident artists directly to children and young people in our region.

Our vision is to play a vital and dynamic role in the development of new work across all art forms and creative disciplines, facilitating opportunities for cultural exchange and enriching our local, national, and international communities.

Our values underpin every aspect of our work, from the delivery of Cove Park's residencies and public engagement programme to the care of our natural environment and commitment to working sustainably. We are guided by these five values: collaborative, open, ethical, international, and ambitious.

Cove Park is proud to have a growing community of individual donors who believe in the vital work we do to promote national and international cultural exchange and ensure our local rural community has access to innovative and free creative learning opportunities. Together we:

- welcome 250+ artists and creative practitioners to Argyll each year
- provide free monthly workshops and events for over 500+ local children and young people each year
- care for our unique landscape and work to revive Argyll's rainforest - in 2022 we planted over 500 indigenous trees

Cove Park is a charity and most of our funding for our residencies and workshops is paid by trusts, foundations and individual donors. Creative Scotland currently funds just 25% of our annual costs and individual philanthropy is essential to sustain our work. As with all charities, funding is becoming more difficult to secure.

Cove Park's new Argyll Associates programme invites individuals and families based locally to become a significant partner in helping us to enrich arts, culture, and creativity in Argyll. This programme provides several unique ways for Argyll Associates to engage with Cove Park: meeting the national and international artists we work with, taking part in exclusive events - such as readings, artists talks, screenings, summer dinners and studio tours - and spending time at one of Argyll's most beautiful and inspiring locations.
