Located just one hour north west of Glasgow on Argyll's Rosneath Peninsula, Cove Park is an international artist residency set in a 50-acre rural site overlooking Loch Long and the firth of Clyde.

In addition to supporting artists and creative practitioners through year-round residencies, commissions, and creative projects, Cove Park offers unique spaces for day hire, perfect for those seeking an inspiring environment for meetings and away days.

Whether you are a business seeking a change of pace for a team away day, an artist delivering a workshop, or an educator leading a creative learning activity, Cove Park provides a flexible and welcoming context for focussed discussion, collaboration, and the development of new ideas.

The Monument Trust Room is bright and spacious with large windows and sliding glass door opening out onto decking and Cove Park's site. Its natural light and simple design offers a flexible space for meetings, workshops, or creative sessions.

ROBERTSON TRUST ROOM

The Robertson Trust Room offers outstanding views across Loch Long and Cowal Peninsula. Its sliding pocket doors, concealed behind library shelving, make possible a private, self-contained space.

This Room is ideal for smaller group gatherings or meetings. Black out blinds allow for film screenings and presentations.

Cove Park has a variety of trestle tables, workshop tables, chairs, and sofas that can be configured to create the ideal seating arrangement for your event.

THE JACOBS BUILDING

The Jacobs Building is Cove Park's communal space for residents, visitors, programme participants, and the team. This award-winning, purpose-built, and flexible space was designed by CameronWebster Architects and opened in 2016.

The Jacobs Building has a central open plan and level access entrance hall with large kitchen, dining area, lounge, and woodburning stove.

The main hall leads to The Monument Trust Room and The Robertson Trust Room. The building also houses Cove Park's growing reference library, study area, two offices, a store for e-bikes, and a laundry room.
